

Environmental Justice RESOURCE CORNER Tips for Sustainable Living: Plastic

When you're recycling plastic, remember: 1) all items should be empty, rinsed, clean, and open; 2) don't put recycling in plastic bags or garbage bags. Here's what can – and can't – be recycled:

In:

- Plastic bottles, with or without caps attached
- Plastic containers & lids
- Plastic single-use cups no lids, no straws

Out:

- Loose bottle caps
- Plastic bags & wrap (plastic bags can be recycled at Stop & Shop in the bottle return area)
- Plastic plates, bowls & utensils
- Prescription bottles
- Single-use coffee containers, like Keurig pods
- Styrofoam cups, containers & packing peanuts
